

## THE DALRYMPLE-CHAMPNEYS AWARD CRITERIA FOR CITATIONS

*The Dalrymple-Champneys Selection Committee invites nominations for the Award.*

**The Dalrymple-Champneys Award is presented to a member of the British Veterinary Association to mark and recognise work of outstanding merit which, it is considered, will encourage the advancement of veterinary science.**

The Award shall be made to the author of work which is considered to be of outstanding merit, pertaining to any branch of veterinary science. The Award shall also be open to those who have done work which has not been published, or have undertaken other activities which are considered to have encouraged the advancement - and dissemination of knowledge - of veterinary science and medicine.

Nominations should be presented (**using the nomination form**) under the following headings:

- i) supporting statement summarising the nominee's most distinctive contribution to the profession (max 100 words);
- ii) contributions to the advancement of knowledge in veterinary science and medicine (citing the ten most significant publications - if appropriate);
- iii) other scientific contributions, such as those in comparative medicine, which enhance the reputation of veterinary science; and
- iv) service to the veterinary profession such as to the BVA and RCVS, and elsewhere.

An appendix listing the nominee's publications in chronological order, classified under peer-reviewed publications, non-refereed articles and talks should be attached. (NB: Certain nominees may have only very limited publications but may have contributed significantly in identifying some important clinical or scientific condition or its associations).

Nominations may be submitted by members of the Dalrymple-Champneys Selection Committee, by divisions of the British Veterinary Association or by individual members of the Association.
