Professor George J Gunn BVMS Glasgow University 1981, worked in large animal veterinary practice before joining SAC (Scottish Agricultural College) as a disease outbreak investigation officer. Awarded MSc Population Medicine (Analytical Epidemiology) University of Guelph, Canada he is now SAC Professor of Population Medicine and Zoonoses, a visiting Professor at Glasgow University, a Diplomate of both the European Colleges of Veterinary Public Health and Bovine Health Management and a RCVS Specialist in Epidemiology. Currently the Head of Veterinary Epidemiology and Research Team Leader in SAC's Animal Health Group and also the Director of EPIC, the Scottish Government Centre of Excellence in Veterinary Epidemiology. George's main interest remains population medicine with focus on livestock disease control, active surveillance, disease economics and zoonoses with recent research into the epidemiology and control of infectious diseases, such as BVD and VTECs.
